NOTICE

Port Business Purpose Cards are issued to individuals with the understanding that the cardholder will adhere to established security procedures. As required by law, all individuals unable or unwilling, upon request of facility personnel to establish their identity or account for their presence will have their access credential and privilege revoked.

The Facility Security Officer may suspend or revoke the credential of any individual in the following categories;

- 1. Any individual unable or unwilling to establish their identity and/or account for their presence in a secure or restricted area.
- 2. Any individual who is found violating established security procedures.
- 3. Any individual who violates a State or Federal law while on Port property,
- 4. Any individual who fails to follow verbal or written instructions, issued by competent authority, that are intended to enhance safety, security or environmental compliance while on Port property..
- 5. Any physical confrontation with another individual while on Port property. In cases of mutual combat or affray, access of all individuals involved may be suspended
- 6. Refusal to follow direction of any Tampa Port Authority security personnel or law enforcement.
- 7. Refusal to submit to an inspection while in the secure or restricted area.
- 8. Possession of an unauthorized weapon while in the secure or restricted area.
- 9. Failure to display a Port credential or failure to have a credential available for display upon demand while in the secure or restricted area,
- 10. Parking in an unauthorized area.
- 11. Load shifting or leveling where prohibited.
- 12. Unauthorized or illegal dumping.
- 13. Failure to adhere to procedures contained in any Coast Guard-approved Facility Security Plan.
- 14. Any violation of Florida Statutes or traffic law that affects the security or safety of the Port.
- 15. Any violation of Federal regulations that affects the safety or security of the Port.
- 16. Any incident on Port property that results in an individual's arrest.

Note: An arrest is not required to suspend an individual's access privilege.

Arrest for Trespass:

Under State statute, individuals found in restricted access areas without appropriate credentials are subject to arrest for trespass.

I have read the above. I further understand that I can lose my access privileges for violation of any of the above.
