PORT TAMPA BAY STANDARD WORK PERMIT APPLICATION #16-021

Orion Construction, Inc., aka Orion Marine Group, Inc., has applied to Port Tampa Bay for a Standard Work Permit for the following: (i) construction of an approximately 723 linear foot steel sheet pile bulkhead, (ii) filling of approximately 0.40 acres of submerged lands owned by Orion Construction Group, Inc., (iii) dredging of approximately 9,501 cubic yards of material from Rattlesnake Channel, and (iv) demolition of two (2) existing piers at 5440 W. Tyson Avenue, Tampa, Florida on the Rattlesnake Channel.

The proposed project has received recommendations for approval from the Environmental Protection Commission (EPC) of Hillsborough County and has been deemed consistent with the Hillsborough *County-City Comprehensive Plan* by the Hillsborough County City-County Planning Commission.
