Non-Discrimination Policy Statement

Complaint Procedure

Purpose

This procedure outlines how individuals may file a complaint regarding alleged discrimination under Title VI. It applies to complaints involving Port Tampa Bay or its contractors, sub-recipients, or consultants.

Who May File

Any person or group who believes they have been subjected to discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin may file a written complaint within 180 days of the alleged incident by completing the Title VI Complaint Form.

How to File

Complaints must be submitted in writing using the Title VI Complaint Form, and must include:

- Complainant's full name and contact information
- Date(s) of alleged discrimination
- Description of the incident and basis of the complaint
- Names of individuals and witnesses involved, if known
- Complainant's signature (or legal representative's with written permission)
